

## FUND STRATEGY

The Tocqueville Gold Fund seeks to achieve its investment objective by investing at least 80% of its net assets, plus borrowings for investment purposes, in gold and other precious metals and securities of companies located throughout the world that are engaged in mining or processing gold. The Fund follows a value approach to investing and the portfolio manager will identify companies that are undervalued based on his judgment of relative value and growth potential.

## QUARTERLY UPDATE

- Gold prices rose slightly during the first quarter of 2019, finishing at \$1,299 per ounce after averaging about \$75 more than in 4Q 2018 at \$1,304 per ounce. Initially, gold received a lift from the late 2018 market correction and the U.S. government shut-down, while the U.S. Federal Reserve's decision to pause on raising interest rates and the market's concerns surrounding inflation set gold on a pace to trade higher. However, gold prices softened late in the first quarter as markets focused on wavering consumer confidence and slowing global growth along with the U.S./China trade negotiations.
- During 1Q 2019, the Fund rose 5.82% while the Philadelphia Gold and Silver Index rose 8.26%. The top contributors to performance included Mag Silver, SEMAFO, and Wheaton Precious Metals, which recovered from lower valuations during 2018. Detractors for the quarter were Corvus Gold, OceanaGold, and Pan American Silver, which outperformed in late 2018 and corrected slightly during the first quarter.
- The argument for an investment in gold and precious metals mining stocks, we believe, has never been supported with as many considerations as now. Taken together, they make an extremely powerful argument for a timely investment in the precious metals sector. Should inflation rise, the markets fall, the economy slump, the dollar weaken, deficits widen, or populism run rampant, we expect gold to benefit. However, should these unexpected and unwanted outcomes interact, serious potential for a credit meltdown, similar or worse than the 2008 global financial crisis, would seem possible. Ground zero for the next systemic crisis could be sovereign credit itself. The promise to do "whatever it takes" in monetary and fiscal policies, no matter how drastic or innovative, we believe would now appear ineffective.
- We feel that exposure to the precious metals sector, which in our opinion is the only systemically bulletproof asset that is both liquid and readily deployable, should prove beneficial, even in small portions.

The Tocqueville Gold Fund's investment objective is long-term capital appreciation.



Prior to joining Tocqueville in 2008, Mr. McIntyre was an associate focused on mergers and acquisitions in the metals and mining sector with the Macquarie Group. He earned a BA in Commerce with Distinction from Dalhousie University and an MBA from the Yale School of Management.

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

**P/E:** The weighted average of the price/earnings (P/E) ratios of the equity securities referenced. The P/E ratio is calculated by dividing the current price of the stock by the trailing earnings per share for the past 12 months.

**The Philadelphia Stock Exchange Gold/Silver Index** is a good indicator of the performance of the common stock of companies in the gold and silver mining industry. It does not incur fees and expenses. **The S&P 500 Index** is a market-value weighted index consisting of 500 stocks chosen for market size, liquidity, and industry group representation. You cannot invest directly in an index.

**The Morningstar Equity Precious Metals Portfolio** focuses on mining stocks, though some do own small amounts of gold bullion. Most portfolios concentrate on gold-mining stocks, but some have significant exposure to silver-, platinum-, and base-metal-mining stocks as well. Precious-metals companies are typically based in North America, Australia, or South Africa.

The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance.
